Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The November dead list envelops will be are the back of the church for those who would like to request masses for their deceased relatives and friends

Remember that it is important that we keep the social distancing rule whenever you walk into the church to pray. Remember also to wear your face mask and

use the hand sanitizer when you are in the church. Our able stewards will always be there to direct people and to make sure we keep to the instructions.

We will now continue all our masses on zoom at 10.00am everyday including Sundays until the lockdown is over. There will be no zoom mass on Wednesdays.

There will be foodbank trolley also positioned in the church for people to donate food for the food bank.
