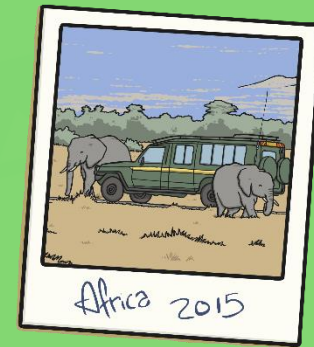

Creative Commons

Most pictures on the World Wide Web belong to someone and cannot be used, especially in work that is published by someone else.

There is a system called “Creative Commons”, which allows pictures to be used, often with the picture being attributed (clearly mentioning who they belong to) to the owner.

Insert Images in a Webpage

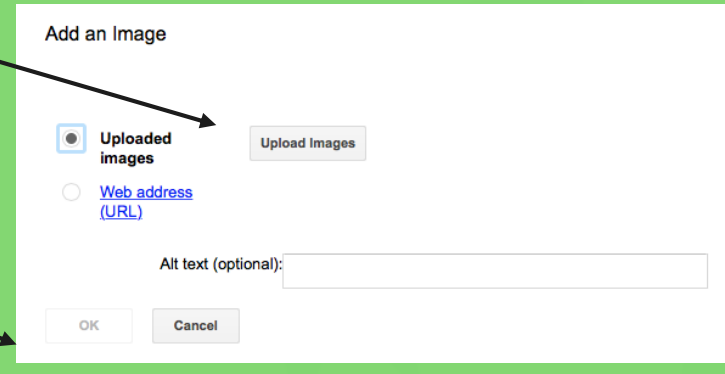
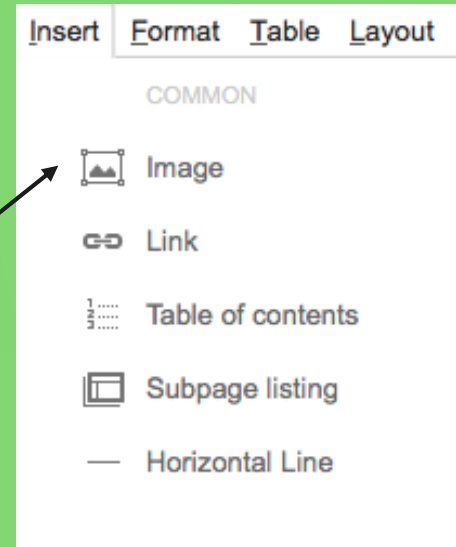


First, find a suitable image of your own or one you are free to use, and save to a folder on your network.

Click on Insert, Image

Click on Upload Images and navigate to the folder in which your image is saved.

Click OK to load the image onto the webpage.

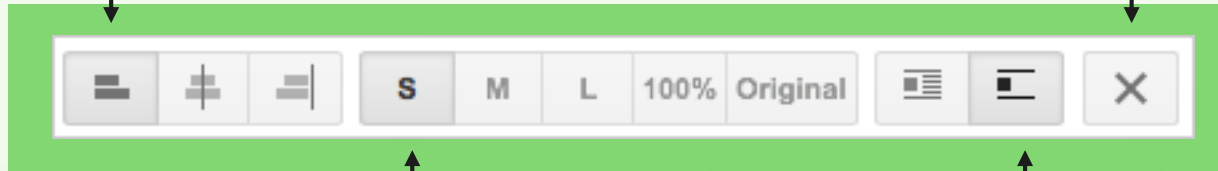


Format an Image

Click on the image to bring up the formatting menu.

1. Go to commons.wikimedia.org Search for an image and select any suitable images.
2. Click Download.

3. Click on a suitable download image file size. Save the file or right click on the picture and "Save file" target as" to save the file in a folder.



Inserting an Image into a Webpage

1. Login to your google site and navigate to your page.
2. Click edit page and place the cursor where you want the image.
3. Click Insert Image.





7. Set the formatting of your image:
 - Left, Center or Right in the column.
 - Small, Medium, Large, 100% or Original.
 - Wrap text or Inline.

Click away from the formatting bar and it will disappear.

You can edit these settings by clicking on the image for the menu bar to reappear.

Search Flickr or Wikimedia Commons for pictures to use in your webpage.

Save some images and save the image owner and address.

Login to the site, open your webpage.

Insert and format the images.
