LF5: I can explore and discuss different hymns and write about their meaning and how and why we can 'live these out' in our daily lives.

There are a number of Eucharistic prayers that may be used at Mass on Sunday. There are some written specifically for children.

In Eucharistic prayer II after everyone has joined in with proclaiming the Mystery of Faith, the priest continues the prayer, offering to God the Father the consecrated bread and wine which is Jesus Christ's own offering. It is a prayer which remembers Jesus. This is part of what the priest says,

*"Therefore, as we celebrate  
the memorial of his Death and Resurrection,  
we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation,  
giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to  
you.  
Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of  
Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit."*

The priest goes on to pray for everyone including those who  
have died
